

# **Going with the Flow**

The old Forester Creek that once wound openly from Santee to wander across downtown El Cajon's Magnolia and Park streets and along Main Street was mostly contained in the mid-1980s in open cement corridors during the excavation and building of our city's then-new City Hall and performing arts center. During that process, a bit of it was captured for a few years alongside the elegant new compound as a small "lake, and a small water feature on the corner of Main and Julian Streets.

More recently, following the guidance and wishes of cities' parks and recreation departments and neighborhood volunteers, San Diego County's San Diego River Park organization is restoring the natural flow of the San Diego River and its subsidiaries by returning natural vegetation and restoring parks and areas lining freeways to the cities and towns through which the rivers and streams flows.

This map illustrates what is being saved, restored and added in our city.



# **History Preserved by Library Technician**

Josephine was the 2nd child of seven born to Josephus and Sarah Asher. The Ashers were friends of Alonzo Horton, the founder of New Town San Diego. When Josephus' health failed, he moved his family to the El Cajon Valley in 1878. After graduation from elementary school, Josephine continued her studies under her mother and also by taking correspondence courses. She eventually received her teaching certificate, her first assignment being at the Cuyamaca School in the Cuyamaca mountain area. She continued to teach in various schools in El Cajon and elsewhere until her retirement in 1941, when she was 71 years old.
