PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Hope this finds you all well.

On a somewhat positive note, with your help, we are making some headway on the budget deficit. The Back Country Opportunity Drawing proved to be very successful and membership renewals continue to come in.

As we were starting to make progress on the deficit we had a setback and a bit of a scare at the Knox House when we received a phone call at 5am on April 29th that there was a smoke alarm going off. We are so thankful that it turned out to be a false alarm and that the fire department folks that responded to the alarm waited until we were able to arrive to open up the Knox house, thus preventing any damage to the Building. As it turned out, three smoke detectors and a heat sensor needed to be

replaced, so \$700 later that part of our security system is now new and upgraded. This potential situation is one of our biggest concerns. I don't think it would be overstating what a catastrophic loss there could be to El Cajon's history if something like this might occur and we lost all the archives. This of course is the main reason why the archives are in the process of being digitized and backed up offsite. This is a huge project so it will be a work in progress for a while.

The new essay contest format (My Family History) provided some interesting and moving essays. This year was a time to learn what went right with the contest and what we might want to change. Not sure how long we will be able to continue the contest, as with all organizations without some new young folks there could be a point when it will not continue. With the essay contest we keep hoping a retired teacher looking for something to do will show up and ensure the contest will be able to continue.

We are really hoping many of you will be able to attend the July quarterly meeting. We will be featuring our most popular program from the past, the Trinity Brothers singing group. The last time they performed for us they received rave reviews.



Society president Russ Stockwell, said 23 students from seven schools were entered in this contest, started six years ago. This year's contest had the greatest number of entries ever submitted.
