FEB. 2, 1956 (Thursday)

Extension of Douglas Street from Prescott to El Cajon Blvd. is proposed to the City Council. Cost estimated is \$135,717. The proposal calls for widening of Douglas to 46 feet Douglas now ends 445 feet west of Van Houten.

Kitchen of Lee Ellis home on Walnut Road damaged by smoke. He had been roasting a pan of pecans, thought he'd turned off the oven and went outside to work.

"Operation Rose Petal" in operation at the Fletcher Hills Sanitation Plant. A special formula being tested to try to cover the smell.

A dog leash law being proposed to the city council -- too many dogs running loose.


